TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Vagliano Trophy was presented to the Comité des Dames de la Fédération Française de Golf and the Ladies' Golf Union by Monsieur A. A. Vagliano, originally for annual competition between teams from France and Great Britain and Ireland.

Since 1959, by mutual agreement, the competition has been a biennial one between teams from the Continent of Europe, Great Britain and Ireland.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

The Vagliano Trophy Continent of Europe Team Selection Committee will use the Ladies European Amateur Rankings (LEAR) to select the first five players, with the other four places reserved for Captain's picks.

Updates on player progress will be available from the EGA website and enquirees as to prospective team members'

availability will be made to the European national golf authorities during the selection period.

SYSTEM OF PLAY

The match consists of four foursomes and eight singles of 18 holes on each of the two days. The foursomes matches are played each morning and the singles in the afternoon. A win counts as one point,

a half yields half a point and a lost match returns zero. In the event of a tie, the trophy shall be retained by the holders.

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TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Junior Vagliano Trophy was created in January 2011 by the LGU and the European Golf Association and first played in June the same year. The event provides an ideal platform for introducing talented young golfers to the pressures and pleasures of team

match play golf and helps supporting Girls' elite Golf. The JVT is played at the same time as the ladies' equivalent, the biennial Vagliano Trophy match.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

As with the Vagliano Trophy, team selection will be conducted by the LGU and EGA for the GB&I and Continent of Europe teams respectively. Updates on player progress will be available from the

EGA website and enquirees as to prospective team members' availability will be made to the European national golf authorities during the selection period.

SYSTEM OF PLAY

12 youngsters, aged 16 and under, going head to head in four sets of matches over a two day period. All six

youngsters will play in two sets of three foursomes and two sets of six singles matches.
