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IPPA Regulation Code

The REGULATION CODE shall govern all IPPA competitions with the intention of covering the major factors involved in organizing a successful event.

IPPA Competition Committee shall establish the conditions under which the competitions will be played and make a publication prior to each event, using the usual means provided: IPPA web master, members' local webs, clubs facilities, etc. These conditions will take into account the following aspects:

1. GENERAL. - Considering **Chapter I1 (Rules) on IPPA Constitution**, where Pitch & Putt is defined as *"the game played on a course of artificial or live grass with the following specifications: maximum distance for each hole = 90m. ; maximum distance for 18 holes = 1.200m.; maximum of 3 clubs, being a putter one of them and possibility of natural or artificial grass for Greens and Teeing grounds"*, all Competitions must be played under the R&A Rules of Golf and the Local Rules established by the Committee. To do so, the National Federation, Union or Association in the country where the competition is played will provide a referee to assist and guarantee a correct procedure.

2. ELEGIBILITY. - Only amateur players holding a national license may participate in IPPA's events. The Committee will decide if players from non-member countries can participate after examination of their requests. Should a competition have a restricted field, the policy to be adopted will give priority for IPPA's members players with the lowest exact handicaps.

3. ENTRY. - Players should complete an entry form that must reach the Committee latest one week before the date of the competition and it should be accompanied by an entry fee. Entries can be forwarded to the National Federation, Union or Association from the country celebrating the competition or through IPPA's web site. The organizing club will receive 75% of them.

4. FORMAT. - The Committee will decide for each case how the competition is to be played and will inform accordingly.

5. HANDICAP. - The Rules of Golf do not legislate for the allocation and adjustment of handicaps. Such matters are within the jurisdiction of the National Union, Federation or Association of the country where the competition is being played. Regardless of the format, all competitions will be played on a scratch basis, hence, only for entry restrictions and special prizes purposes, a player's handicap will be certified by his/her National Organization according to its current guidelines.

6. PRIZES. - The Committee will announce in advance the prizes that are to be awarded in the competition. The conditions published prior to the event will provide for situations such as one player winning both scratch and handicap prizes. The purpose and spirit of the Rules of Amateur Status will never be breached.
